


Delivery Program Progress Report 1 April 2023 to 30 June 2023





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Delivery Program Progress Report – Summary

The following section provides an overview of Council's progress towards delivering its Delivery Program and Operational Plan 2022-23. The Operational Plan contains 180 projects, programs, and activities (annual deliverables) across the five key themes from the Wingecarribee 2031 Community Strategic Plan. Table 1, below, outlines how Council is tracking at the end of the 1 April 2023 to 30 June 2023 reporting period (three-month period) to achieve the annual deliverables for each theme.

At the end of June 2023, 176 annual deliverables were on track, none were on hold, four (4) were delayed, and none were considered critical. Each objective is assigned a coloured brick to signify overall progress, as per the below key:




