In accordance with the Developer Contribution Plan for Open Space, Recreation Community & Cultural Facilities a budget of \$100,000 was designated for project 'Balmoral Village Green -Passive Park'. To date, only \$3,145 has been spent.
Footpath scheduled to be installed out the front of Balmoral Hall is a "footpath to nowhere" and a "waste of money". Can the money allocated for the footpath be reallocated to a footpath for the Balmoral Park Reserve?	As part of Council's strategic management of the footpath network throughout the Wingecarribee Shire, a Pedestrian Access & Mobility Plan (PAMP) was prepared 2007 for all the Small Towns & Villages within the Shire. The PAMP aims to co-ordinate investment in safe, convenient and connected pedestrian routes by providing a comprehensive strategic plan for the development of pedestrian policies and construction of pedestrian facilities.
