Issues raised	Response
<p>Fireweed</p> <p>Along Yuille Rd Bundanoon needs to be treated. Previous email from resident dated 23/8 – no response</p>	<p>Councils Tree Management officer will inspect the roadside to identify any opportunities to treat fireweed.</p>
<p>Bundanoon Entrance</p> <p>\$25,000 was allocated from the Bushfire funds – exactly how much was spent and on what.</p>	<p>As per the Council Report from the 24 Feb 2021, the Roadside Entrance into Bundanoon was provided with \$25,000 for works to be undertaken following the Bushfires.</p> <p>Works were undertaken at the roadside entrance into Bundanoon, however, the works were funded via an alternate funding (sourced from the Commonwealth - State Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements.)</p> <p>Council reallocated the funding from the Tree Removal Works, now covered under the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements, towards the installation of water storage tanks at Wingello, Penrose and Balmoral and that \$282,000 be voted in the 2020/21 Budget to cover this expense.</p>
<p>Water pipes</p> <p>Water pipes from Exeter to Bundanoon were broken during the bushfires – have they been fixed?</p>	<p>The bushfires didn't cause any significant damage to the council water mains distribution pipe network between Exeter and Bundanoon. There were properties suffering bushfire damage to their own internal private service pipes, mainly along Rockleigh Road, Exeter with some Council water meters requiring being replaced.</p> <p>There was damage to the power supply to the Bundanoon water treatment plant and raw water dam sites during the fires that took out water supply to the area which was promptly rectified. There are no outstanding water supply repairs related to those fires.</p>

<p>Bundanoon STP</p> <p>Where is the water being discharged? There are claims that it is being discharged into the river.</p>	<p>The Bundanoon STP is licensed by the EPA to discharges highly treated effluent into Reedy Creek. It also supplies recycled water to utilisation areas at a local farm and the local sports field, which is controlled under a management plan. Bundanoon has a tertiary treatment process and produces high quality effluent that has been through screens, grit removal, biological nutrient removal, chemical phosphorus removal, tertiary filtration and UV disinfection. Bundanoon STP consistently meets it EPA license conditions including effluent concentration limits.</p>
<p>Glow Worm Glen</p> <p>Can Council confirm a date w Parks & Wildlife when the work will be completed?</p>	<p>National Parks and Wildlife Services have indicated Glow Worm Glen track and viewing platform will be repaired by April 2022.</p>
<p>Greasons Road Bundanoon</p>	<p>Meeting held with residents and staff to discuss details for this development.</p>
