

The purpose of this report is to seek Local Traffic Committee's approval for the implementation of the proposed traffic signage and line marking as per the plans issued for Subdivision Works Certificate - Stage 1 of the development in the new subdivision Ashbourne (DA 20/0227.03) at 32 Lovelle Street & 141 Yarrawa Road Moss Vale.

RECOMMENDATION

THAT Council approves:

Proposed traffic signage and line marking plans 800, 801, 802, and 803 issued for Subdivision Works Certificate - Stage 1 of the development in new subdivision Ashbourne DA 20/0227.03 at 32 Lovelle Street & 141 Yarrawa Road, Moss Vale.

<u>THAT</u>, if Transport for NSW approves speed limit reduction 90km/hr to 60km/hr, then supplementary "60km AHEAD" and "END 60km AREA" signage be installed on Yarrawa Road South at Mount Broughton Road as per Road Rules.

<u>THAT</u> "NO ENTRY TRUCKS OVER 19M" be installed in advance of the main entry from Yarrawa Road to the sub-division.

REPORT

BACKGROUND

Ashbourne Estate is a proposed housing land development project, that when complete will cover 123.7 hectares.

Stage one of Asbourne Estate has been approved for construction, with contruction already underway.

The Local Traffic Committee has received a request from Council's Development Assessment & Regulation for further review and approval of SIGNAGE & LINEMARKING PLAN SHEET (Subdivision works certified four pages number: 800, 801, 802, and 803).

<u>REPORT</u>

The land was earmarked as an urban release area in the 2010 Wingecarribee Shire Council Local Environment Plan and has been rezoned for low density residential use.

The SIGNAGE & LINEMARKING plans with all other plans for stage 1 are prepared by Orion Consulting for Ashbourne Moss Vale.

The plans prepared are consistent with the key requirements of AS/1742.2-2009 and NSW Bicycle Guidelines.

Details of proposed Signage and Line marking are as follows:




Fig 1. Proposed Signage


CONSULTATIONS

Comments provided by the traffic team in an earlier consultation as follows:

- 1. A north-eastern access linking the Urban Redevelopment Authority with the Illawarra Highway will be required to alleviate future congestion along Yarrawa Road and through the Moss Vale Town Centre.
- 2. All roundabouts will be mountable, pedestrian friendly and be designed suitable for anticipated traffic volume and vehicle speed as safety issues necessitate. Roundabouts are to be designed and constructed in accordance with relevant Council and TfNSW standards.
- 3. Proposed roundabout at the intersection of existing Yarrawa Road and Road No 1 will act as a traffic calming device and create a deflection along the traffic flow in Yarrawa Road. Traffic must slow before entering this section of Yarrawa Road.
- 4. The existing speed limit of 90km/h is requested to be reduced to 60km/h The existing 90km/h zone currently begins at 38 Yarrawa Road which is a transition from a 50km/h zone. The 60km/h zone is request to extend the intersection of Mount Broughton Road.
- 5. Supplementary "60km AHEAD" and "END 60km AREA" signage be installed on Yarrawa Road South at Mount Broughton Road as per Road Rules.
- 6. "NO ENTRY TRUCKS OVER 19M" be installed in advance of the main entry from Yarrawa Road to the sub-division.

All roundabouts will be mountable, pedestrian friendly and be designed suitable for anticipated traffic volume and vehicle speed as safety issues necessitate. Roundabouts are to be designed and constructed in accordance with relevant Council and TfNSW standards.

Proposed roundabout at the intersection of existing Yarrawa Road and Road No 1 will act as a traffic calming device and create a deflection along the traffic flow in Yarrawa Road. Traffic must slow before entering this section of Yarrawa Road.


Council's Consultant Development Engineer submitted a request to TfNSW for their consideration to reduce the existing speed limit of 90km/h on Yarrawa Road to 60km/h which is proposed to begin from the end of the existing 50km/h at property number 38 Yarrawa Road, and continue up to the intersection of Mount Broughton Road.

It is recommended that Council approves.

- Proposed traffic signage and line marking plans 800, 801, 802, and 803 issued for Subdivision Works Certificate Stage 1 of the development in new subdivision Ashbourne DA 20/0227.03 at 32 Lovelle Street & 141 Yarrawa Road, Moss Vale.
- That, if TfNSW approves a speed limit reduction, supplementary "60km AHEAD" and "END 60km AREA" signage be installed on Yarrawa Road South at Mount Broughton Road as per Road Rules.
- That "NO ENTRY TRUCKS OVER 19M" be installed in advance of the main entry from Yarrawa Road to the sub-division.






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

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6.4 Intersection of Jasmine Street and Merrigang Street Bowral - Give way restriction.

PURPOSE

To recommend for approval a Give Way sign and line markings at the intersection of Jasmine Street and Merrigang Street, Bowral. The signage has been installed by Council following the reconstruction of the adjacent bridge on Merrigang Street over Mittagong Creek.

RECOMMENDATION

THAT the Council approves:

1. The recent installation of a Give way sign, 10m TB line, and 10m unbroken central barrier lines in Jasmine Street at the intersection of Merrigang Street Bowral.

REPORT

BACKGROUND

Council reconstructed the bridge across Mittagong Creek on Merrigang Street, Bowral. The section of Merrigang Street was closed, and traffic flow was diverted to surrounding roads during the time of re-construction of the bridge. Recently the construction completed, and the road is opened for traffic use.

<u>REPORT</u>

The intersection has been inspected. Both Jasmine Street and Merrigang Street are local roads which form a T-intersection. Previously there was no control in place on traffic flow in Jasmine Street at the intersection of Merrigang Street. The east- west traffic flow on Merrigang Street has the priority at this intersection. As part of the works undertaken Council installed a Give way sign, 10m TB line, and 10m unbroken central barrier lines in Jasmine Street at Merrigang Street, Bowral.

The new installation (Give way sign, 10m TB line, and 10m unbroken central barrier lines in Jasmine Street) requires to Traffic Committee approval.

CONCLUSION

The Give Way sign and line marking was installed to provide better delineation to drivers of the right of way and control the traffic flow from Jasmine Street. The location of new Give Way sign and lines has minimum impact on adjoining residents.

Therefore, the recent installation of a Give Way sign, 10m TB line, and 10m unbroken central barrier lines on Jasmine Street at the intersection of Merrigang Street Bowral be approved by the Council as shown in Fig. 2 and 3.

PURPOSE

To advise and have Committee's approval for recent installation of a Give way sign in the intersection of Greasons Road and Kestrel Place, Bundanoon. The developer of the new subdivision in 58 Greasons Street installed a Give way sign in the new road named Kestrel Place at Greasons Road.

RECOMMENDATION

<u>THAT</u> the Council approves:

- **1.** The recent installation by the developer of a Give way sign in Kestrel Place at the intersection of Greasons Road Bundanoon.
- 2. Proposed installation of 10m TB line, and 10m unbroken central barrier lines in Kestrel Place.

REPORT

BACKGROUND

McAlinden Park 58 Greasons Road, Bundanoon is located between the towns of Penrose and Exeter and an easy commute to nearby Bowral and the Hume Highway. The developer of McAlinden Park has created a small community in Bundanoon, with only 16 generous one acre blocks. Refer to Council's SUBDIVISION DEVELOPMENT - DA: 18/0077, 58 Greasons Road, Bundanoon. A new access road to the subdivision Kestrel Place formed a T intersection with Greasons Road.




Fig.1- New Subdivision Map at 58 Greasons Road

<u>REPORT</u>

The intersection of Greasons Road and Kestrel Place has been inspected. Both Greasons Road and Kestrel Place are local roads forming a T-intersection. The north-south traffic flow on Greasons Road has the priority in this intersection. As part of commitment the developer installed a Give way sign in Kestrel Place at Greasons Road, Bundanoon. The new sing installation need to be approved by the Committee.

Currently TB line (10m), and unbroken central barrier lines (10m) are missing and need to be installed in Kestrel Place in combination with new Give way sign.

CONCLUSION

The traffic flow of Kestrel Place needs to be controlled by installing a Give Way restriction in it. The location of new Give Way sign will have minimum impact on adjoining residents.

Therefore, Council approves the recent installation of a Give way sign, in Kestrel Place at the intersection of Greasons Road Bundanoon; and

Recommend the proposed installation of 10m TB line, and 10m unbroken central barrier lines in Kestrel Place.

6.6 **1** Church Street Bundanoon - Request for a Accessible Parking space and review of parking signs

PURPOSE

To install an Accessible Parking space in Church Steet fronting the Bundanoon Pharmacy and Post Office and to enforce 2P parking restrictions for four existing unrestricted spaces (90° angle parking rear to kerb vehicles under 6m only) within Council area adjacent to the intersection of Railway Avenue, Bundanoon.

RECOMMENDATION

<u>THAT</u> Council approves:

- 1. The proposed modification and conversion of the existing parallel parking space to a 3200mm x 7800mm Accessible Parallel parking space as per AS2890.6, Clause 2.2.2(a) in Church Steet fronting Bundanoon Pharmacy and Post Office adjacent to the intersection of Railway Avenue.
- 2. The proposed installation of 2P parking restrictions signs for the four existing unrestricted (90° angle parking rear to kerb vehicles under 6m only) spaces in Council area adjacent to the intersection of Railway Avenue, Bundanoon.
- 3. The upgrade of the existing ramp from the pavement to the Pharmacy and the post office.
- 4. The maintenance of delineation of kerb side parallel parking/90° angle parking spaces fronting 1 Church Street.

REPORT

BACKGROUND

Council has received a request from Bundanoon Community Association (BCA), Bundanoon that Council investigate and propose solutions to

- Bundanoon's disability access to all retail services in Bundanoon, many of which have only access via steps.
- The provision of disability parking spaces in the shopping area.

REPORT

The location is the intersection of Church Street and Railway Avenue adjacent to Bundanoon Railway Station. Currently parking in this location is '90°Angle Parking rear to kerb vehicles under 6m only'. The area was marked and delineated for 16 perpendicular parking spaces inside the Railway property and 4 kerbside perpendicular spaces in Council area. An additional parallel parking space with a ramp exists fronting 1 Church Street.

A review of the intersection has determined that it is possible to modify and convert the existing parallel parking space with a ramp to a 3200mm x 7800mm Accessible Parking space as

recommended in AS2890.6, Clause 2.2.2(a). The current parking in this location '90°Angle Parking rear to kerb vehicles under 6m only' will remains unchanged.

As the area is in the proximity to the shops and Bundanoon railway station the parking demand is high in the peak times. Therefore, the parking in Church Street should be time restricted to ease the availability of parking.

It is further recommended that the four perpendicular spaces in Church Street be 2P timed restricted with current rear to kerb restrictions.

Please see the plans below.

PROPOSAL

- (a) To modify and convert existing parallel parking space to a 3200mm x 7800mm Accessible Parallel parking space as per AS2890.6, Clause 2.2.2(a) in Church Steet fronting Bundanoon Pharmacy and Post Office adjacent to the intersection of Railway Avenue;
- (b) Installation of 2P parking restrictions signs for four existing unrestricted (90° angle parking rear to kerb vehicles under 6m only) spaces in Council area adjacent to the intersection of Railway Avenue, Bundanoon;
- (c) Upgrade the existing ramp from the pavement to the Pharmacy and the post office; and
- d Maintenance of delineation of kerb side parallel parking/90° angle parking spaces fronting Church Street.

CONSULTATIONS

The proposed review of the parking spaces in Church Street will have minimum impact on parking in this location. Sometimes it is hard to park and gain access to the Bundanoon Pharmacy. The changes will carter to the growing demand for parking in this area. The proposed changes will support/help parking and access to shops in Bundanoon for those residents with a walking disability. Based on the above, a wider consultation has not been undertaken.




Fig.3: Proposed Parking in Church Street adjacent to Railway Avenue, Bundanoon.

CONCLUSION

It is recommended that Council approves:

- 1. The proposed modification and conversion of existing parallel parking space to a 3200mm x 7800mm Accessible Parallel parking space as per AS2890.6, Clause 2.2.2(a) in Church Steet fronting Bundanoon Pharmacy and Post Office adjacent to the intersection of Railway Avenue.
- **2.** The installation of 2P parking restrictions signs for four existing unrestricted (90° angle parking rear to kerb vehicles under 6m only) spaces in Council area adjacent to the intersection of Railway Avenue, Bundanoon.
- 3. The upgrade of existing ramp from the pavement to the Pharmacy and the post office.

4. The maintenance of delineation of kerb side parallel parking/90° angle parking spaces fronting 1 Church Street.

All devises are part of the 'Get NSW Active Program'.

REPORT

BACKGROUND

The Get NSW Active program provides local councils with funding for projects that create safe, easy and enjoyable walking and cycling trips. These trips help to relieve pressure on our roads and public transport networks and are part of a healthy lifestyle for NSW communities.

Completed pedestrian refuge and crossing in the roundabout at Kangaloon Road and the section of 2,500mm wide concrete shared path on the eastern side of Eridge Park Road, Burradoo form part of The Get NSW Active program.

REPORT

Get NSW Active's strategic objectives are aimed at:

- improving bike riding to and within centres, neighbourhoods and to key destinations.
- improving walkability in centres, neighbourhoods and at key destinations.
- enabling vibrant centres and liveable neighbourhoods through the creation of street environments that prioritise walking and cycling.

Transport for NSW under this grants program, encourages councils to plan ahead, develop a program of works and consider different funding options for proposed projects.

This approach enables Transport for NSW to progressively plan and expand networks and support councils to develop a sustainable forward program of walking and cycling projects that provides tangible benefits for our communities and customers.

Eridge Park Road Walking Path was included in to Get NSW Active FY22/23 Approved List. The funding amount was \$679,225.

This project is providing a 2.5m path on Eridge Park Road, which will serve a purpose in connecting residents of the Moss Vale & Bowral Localities. This project forms part of the overall Eridge Park Road improvements as follows:

- The reconstruction & widening works of Eridge Park Road with road shoulder widening.
- Footpath construction.
- upgrading the road surface.
- installing curve and reflective pavement markers and
- upgrading the Sunninghill Avenue and Osbourne Street T-intersections.

6.7.1 Eridge Park Road Footpath - Drawing Suite (IF C)











PURPOSE

To review the design plans for the two proposed car parking areas forming part of the upgrade works to Bong Bong Common, Burradoo.

RECOMMENDATION

<u>THAT</u> the design plans for the proposed car parking areas for the Bong Bong Common upgrade be recommended for approval and implementation.

REPORT

BACKGROUND

Bong Bong Common is a historic site that features an accessible pathway, cycleway, seating, walking, and scenic riverfront settings.

In 2023, the Common is being upgraded to include new play space areas, improved car parking, and other features to improve the area's amenity and riverfront access and highlight the site's significance to both Aboriginal and European histories.

REPORT

Carpark 1

The proposed parking areas will provide crucial access to the new facilities that form part of Bong Bong Common.

The first car park design includes an upgrade of the existing car park area that is accessed from, and positioned adjacent to Moss Vale Road.

The existing car park is not line marked and is bordered by a deep open vegetated storm water drain which is a safety hazard for pedestrians and vehicles.

The design formalises the car parking spaces with line marking, includes accessible spaces, and replaces the table drain with piped drainage.




Image 2 – Proposed carpark layout (northern end)




Image 3 – Proposed carpark layout (southern end)

Carpark 2

The second carpark is a new carpark with access from the Cecil Hoskins Reserve access road.

The new carpark will include 24 spaces, with two being accessible spaces. Wheel stops will be provided for all parking spaces.

Access to Loyalty Lane is proposed to be relocated along Cecil Hoskins Reserve access road and away from the current location close near the Moss Vale Road/Cecil Hoskins Reserve access road intersection.




Image 4 – Proposed carpark 2

CONCLUSION








Image 5 – Proposed accessible parking space




Image 6 – Proposed pedestrian zebra crossing and refuge


CONCLUSION

Traffic controllers will :-

- remove Permit Holder Only signs and set up Disabled parking zone along the northern shoulder of Wingecarribee Street nearest to the Bendooley Street intersection.

- set up a temporary pedestrian ramp on the kerb of Wingecarribee Street in the middle of the disabled parking zone.

MERRIGANG STREET.

Traffic controllers will install Bus Zone signs allowing buses only to park temporarily along the southern shoulder of Merrigang Street between Bendooley Street and the western boundary of Corbett Gardens.







Section 4 - PUBLIC CONSIDERATIONS

4.1 Patrons and other Pedestrians

MERRIGANG STREET & WINGECARRIBEE STREET.

There will be no restrictions to public pedestrians and event patrons on the footpath outside of Corbett Gardens in Merrigang Street and Wingecarribee Street.

BENDOOLEY STREET

The footpath outside of Corbett Gardens on Bendooley Street will be delineated on the approach to the main entry gate into the gardens.

The footpath is 3.3 metres wide.

It will be divided into a 1.5 metre wide aisle beside the gardens fence for patrons to queue outside of the entry gate for 20 metres towards Wingecarribee Street and for 40 metres towards Merrigang Street.

There will be 1.7 - 1.8 metres remaining for public pedestrian access along the footpath past the entry gate to the gardens.

4.2 Public Transport

Public transport will not be affected.

05-06-23. Spoke to Chris Moule (operations manager) at Berrima Bus-lines.

- Chris confirmed that the existing bus zone outside of Corbett Gardens in Merrigang Street is not part of the town service stops and is not used by Berrima Bus-lines.
- The bus zone is apparently for charter buses visiting Bowral or the Corbett Gardens throughout the year.

The extension to the bus zone during Tulip Time will not affect Berrima Bus-lines.

4.3 Emergency Vehicles

The signage installation and parking restrictions will not have an effect on emergency vehicles travelling past Corbett Gardens.



PURPOSE

Reporting on the traffic management arrangements for the 2023 Bowral Classic event.

RECOMMENDATION

<u>THAT</u> there is no objection to the traffic arrangements proposed for the 2023 Bowral Classic events on Saturday 21 October and Sunday 22 October subject to approval by the Police and completion of the approval process for Class 2 Race Events as per the NSW Guidelines for Bicycle Road Races and the Guide to Traffic and Transport Management for Special Events including the approval of specified speed reductions and granting of Road Occupancy Licenses (ROL) by TfNSW.

<u>THAT</u> the Traffic Management Plan be updated to include the changed course route along Kangaloon Road.

REPORT

The sixth instalment of the Bowral Classic will take place on Saturday 21 October and Sunday 22 October 2023.

The Bowral Classic is a road cycling event that takes place on roads throughout the Wingecarribee Shire. The event includes three courses, the 150km Maxi Classic, the 125km Challenge Classic, and the 90km Rouleurs Classic. The ride starts at Bong Bong St, Bowral, between 6.30am and 8am.

The event village will be located at Bradman Oval, Bowral. The first riders will return to Bradman Oval from 10:00am. The last riders are expected to cross the finish line around 15.30pm.

Riders from all over Australia have registered for the event. Many will be staying in the Southern Highlands over the weekend bringing economic benefits to the local region.

An 'elite self-nominated group' of a (maximum) 75 riders will participate in the 150km Maxi Classic course, this group of riders is referred to as Highlanders.

When registering riders will be asked to provide their current Cycling Australia Race License. This is to ensure they are experienced at riding in teams or bunches.

Even though this event is not a race, this first group will be riding in an envelope with vehicles front and back for safety.

The vehicles in this group will be –

- 1 x Police vehicle (front)
- 1 x Mechanic

- 1 x Medical Vehicle (both rear). 3.3 Rouleurs Classic – 85KM

Participants will be riding on open roads with traffic. Riders must obey all traffic rules and regulations, especially Police instructions. Event vehicles from the organisation will limit the speed of the riders at some points during the ride. In this case, the riders are forbidden to overtake the organisation vehicles. Any rider who violates this rule, will be disqualified from the event, resulting in a DNF.

Please see attached Traffic Management Plan and Traffic Guidance Scheme for traffic management details.

CONCLUSION

The Bowral Classic is a major event impacting upon an extensive part of the Shire but also promoting the area nationally and bringing in many thousands of visitors. The event organisers work closely with Council to minimise disruption and to follow the "Guidelines for Bicycle Road Races" and the "Guide to Traffic and Transport Management for Special Events".

The traffic management arrangements for 2023 Bowral Classic are recommended for approval.
