5 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Projects Funded for the 23/24 year are: Learner Driver Graduated Licencing Scheme workshops, Learner Driver Logbook Runs, 65 Plus Senior Driver Safety workshops, Child restraint fittings and Motorcycle Awareness.

'U turn the wheel' and the Speed Busters speed management campaign are also being managed by the Road Safety Officer.

The intention is to increase a driver's awareness of their travel speed upon approaching towns and villages with high/higher pedestrian activity, thus helping to reduce the risk of road related trauma.		
			The four original solar powered speed display signs are currently situated at Exeter, Bundanoon, Wingello and Robertson.

The second sign has been installed on Throsby Street Moss Vale. After some initial difficulty both signs are now operational.		
			Further, Councils Environmental team have secured funding and purchased two Variable Message Signs (VMS) which are used to warn motorists in high roadkill areas being ,Tugalong Road, Old Hume Highway Yerinbool and Tourist Road. These signs can collect speed data of vehicles. The Tourist Road sign has detected concerning driver behaviour.

6.3 Proposed Bus Stop on Isedale Road, Nattai Ponds

PURPOSE

To provide a new bus stop location on Isedale Road, Nattai Ponds.

RECOMMENDATION

<u>THAT</u> the proposed new bus stop location on Isedale Road, Nattai Ponds be recommended for approval

THAT the owners of No. 17 Mimosa Place are consulted with before the installation of a Bus Zone

REPORT

Previously, school buses picking up and dropping off school children around Nattai Ponds and Braemar would pull over at a bus stop on the Old Hume Highway, south of the Nattai Ponds traffic signals. The road shoulder allowed the bus to move completely off the travel lane.



Image 1 – Previous bus stop location shown in blue

Recent road works and traffic facility construction has reduced the shoulder width causing the bus to not be able to clear the travel lane. Old Hume Highway is an 80km/h speed zone.

Berrima Bus Lines have raised safety concerns with buses parking in the travel lane and have proposed that a new Bus Zone location be created on Isedale Road, Nattai Ponds. Buses would enter Isedale Road from the traffic signals on Old Hume Highway.

The proposed Bus Zone would be located along the frontage of No. 17 Mimosa Place. No. 17 Mimosa Place has a residential address to Mimosa Place but also has a frontage on Isedale Road. The Bus Zone is proposed to be 30m long.

The bus would pick up and drop off at the proposed Bus Zone, then U-turn at the roundabout at Kamilaroi Crescent, and return to the traffic signals to access back to Old Hume Highway.

The Bus Zone is proposed to operate between 8:00am and 9:00am Monday to Friday and 3:00pm and 4:00pm Monday to Friday. There is a No Stopping Zone on the approach to the proposed Bus Zone which will be 30m in length.

CONCLUSION

There is currently no safe Bus Zone location for children from Nattai Ponds and Braemar to catch a bus. The proposed Bus Zone location on Isedale Road will provide a safe place for children to be picked up and dropped off. The proposed Bus Zone is located close to traffic signals on Old Hume Highway, allowing children to cross Old Hume Highway safely. The proposed Bus Zone is recommended for approval.

6.4 Traffic Committee Requirements in Relation to Coffee and Cars Monthly Event

PURPOSE

To clarify that there is no statutory requirement from the Local Traffic Committee that a traffic management plan is to be implemented for the Coffee and Cars monthly gathering.

RECOMMENDATION

<u>THAT</u> There is no statutory requirement from the Local Traffic Committee that a traffic management plan is to be implemented for the Coffee and Cars monthly gathering.

BACKGROUND

Coffee and Cars is a monthly gathering which is held in Berrima. Promotion of Coffee and Cars is primarily through social media and word of mouth.

Coffee and Cars is a gathering of car enthusiasts and spectators that come to Berrima on the last Sunday of each month to view cars, socialise, and purchase coffee, food and other goods.

The duration is approximately two hours on each occasion.

REPORT

In relation to clarification as to whether there is a statutory requirement from the Local Traffic Committee for a traffic management plan in relation to the Cars and Coffee monthly gatherings, it is confirmed that there is not. One of the three delegations from TfNSW to the Local Traffic Committee is review and approval of traffic control measures for special events. TfNSW has developed a 'Guide to Traffic and Transport Management for Special Events' (the Guide) which is to provide a common understanding across the stakeholders of NSW Police, local councils and TfNSW. The guide is available on the TfNSW website.

The guide identifies the four types of special events, providing examples for each:

- Class 1: is an event that impacts major traffic & transport systems and there is significant disruption to the non-event community. For example: an event that affects a principal transport route in Sydney, or one that reduces the capacity of the main highway through a country town.
- Class 2: is an event that impacts local traffic and transport systems and there is low scale disruption to the non-event community. For example: an event that blocks off the main street of a town or shopping centre but does not impact a principal transport route or a highway.

- Class 3: is an event with minimal impact on local roads and negligible impact on the non-event community. For example: an on-street neighbourhood Christmas party.
- Class 4: is an event that is conducted entirely under Police control (but is not a protest or demonstration). For example: a small march conducted with a Police escort.

Reviewing the types of special events, it is concluded that the Cars and Coffee monthly gathering does not meet the definitions or examples for any of the event classes. This aligns with existing planning advice, in that although the Cars and Coffee gathering is an event – 'event' is a broad description that encompasses a range of activities. Events only require approval when they include distinct elements and as the Cars and Coffee gathering is not a ticketed event and does not alter the usage of the road reserve (in that roads are not closed off, parking areas are not repurposed and there is no application for exclusive use), there is no relevant approval under the Roads Act 1993 nor in TfNSW's delegation to Local Traffic Committee.

CONCLUSION

There is no relevant approval under the Roads Act 1993 nor in TfNSW's delegation to Local Traffic Committee to require that a traffic management plan be implemented for the Coffee and Cars monthly gatherings.

6.5 Angels in our Town Street Parade, Bong Bong Street, Bowral

PURPOSE

To assess the traffic management plan and traffic guidance scheme for Angels is our Town street parade.

RECOMMENDATION

<u>THAT</u> the proposed traffic arrangements for 'Angels in our Town' street parade, proposed to be held on 2 December 2023 on Bong Bong Street, Bowral, be recommended for approval subject to the implementation of the approved Traffic Management Plan and approval from the Police Service in accordance with the Guide to Traffic and Transport Management for Special Events for a Class 2 event.

REPORT

Angels in our Town is a community event which celebrates first responders, volunteers and service organisations in the local area.

The event includes a parade with participants traveling along Bong Street, between Banyette Street and Wingecarribee Street. The proposed date of the Angels in our Town parade is Saturday 2 December 2023, starting at 7:00pm and concluding at 8:00pm.

Various car parks and streets around the Bowral CBD will be closed to the public to allow for event participant parking and assembly area. The roads will systematically be opened as the parade progresses.

The attached Traffic Management Plan and Traffic Guidance Schemes contain further details.

CONCLUSION

Angels in our Town street parade was held last year with a positive reception from event participants and the community. Road closure, parking and assembly area arrangements have been modified from the event last year to have less of an impact on local businesses.

Angels in our Town street parade is a positive community event that allows community members a chance to show their appreciation for first responders, volunteers and service organisations.

Angels in our Town street parade is recommended for approval.

- has been produced in consultation with Event Management, Police, Local Council, TFNSW, and other stakeholders.
- takes into consideration the safety of patrons and event participants, and with emphasis on the safe passage of all traffic and pedestrians either involved in the event or travelling through or around the event area.
- takes into consideration the disruption to the local community, business' and traders.
- takes into consideration emergency services routes through or around the event area.
- is the document to be referred to by event staff regarding any traffic management at the event.
- is one of the documents to be referred to by traffic staff regarding to the risk of terrorism at the event.
- is written as a document for relevant authorities to refer to when considering the issue of any traffic management permits and approvals for the event.
- is written to ensure that traffic management at the event is implemented in accordance with A.S.1742.3 2019, and the TfNSW Manual Traffic Control At Work Sites 2020 (version 6).
- has been developed by a traffic management planner with qualifications to 'Prepare A Work Zone Traffic Management Plan'.

2.4 Event General Description

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Section 3. STREET PARADE DETAILS

3.1 Street Parade details .

A police vehicle will lead the parade.

Behind the lead police vehicle in the following order:-

- our patron and dignitaries in two cars.
- other parade vehicles
- mounted police and horse & carriage
- parade walkers.
- Tail vehicle.

The parade vehicles will assemble along the northern shoulders of Banyette Street, between Station Street and Bong Bong Street.

Any parade participants, except emergency vehicles, arriving after 6.45 p.m. may be denied entry into the Street Parade or be relocated to the rear of the parade.

The parade walkers will assemble in the southern section of the Station Street car park.

Prior to the parade start, the parade walkers will cross Station Street and reassemble in the section of Banyette Street, between the Aldi supermarket entrance and Bong Bong Street.

The crossing of parade walkers on Station Street will be done using traffic controllers to stop vehicles on Station Street while this occurs.

The street parade will :-

- commence at the intersection of Banyette Street and Bong Bong Street at 7.00 p.m.
- travel north along Bong Street to the Wingecarribee Street intersection.

The parade will finish at the Corbett Plaza pedestrian mall.

- parade vehicles will proceed straight ahead to the Merrigang Street intersection where they will return to normal road rules and regulations.
- parade walkers will turn right at the Wingecarribee Street intersection and proceed eastward through the pedestrian mall.

3.1 Running Schedule

- 6.00 a.m. Traffic controllers on duty:-
 - in the southern section of the Station Street car-park.
 - along the roadside parking spaces in Banyette Street between Argyle Lane and Bong Bong Street.

TC's will ask drivers arriving to use the public parking spaces in these areas to please park elsewhere if they will still be parked in these areas after 5.00 p.m.

If the drivers intend to leave before 5.00 p.m., they will be able to park in these areas.

3.2 Assembly Areas

STATION STREET.

The southern section of the car park in Station Street will be closed to public parking at 5.00 p.m. for the assembly of the street parade walkers.

Parade pedestrian groups getting into costumes in Springetts Arcade will use public footpaths and existing pedestrian crossing points to walk from the arcade to the Station Street car park assembly area.

Parade pedestrians will access the assembly area from the footpath on the eastern side of Station Street.

Traffic controllers will stop traffic when event walkers are crossing Station Street at the designated crossing point.

BANYETTE STREET.

The northern shoulders of Banyette Street, between Bong Bong Street and the Aldi supermarket entrance will also be used as part of the assembly area.

The shoulders on this section of Banyette Street will be closed to public parking at 5.00 p.m.

This section of Banyette Street will be closed to all public traffic at 6.00 p.m. and re-opened at approximately 7.15 p.m.

Parade vehicles will access the vehicle assembly area from the Station Street end of Banyette Street.

A traffic controller at the 'Aldi' road closure point will allow parade vehicles past the road closure and into the assembly area.

3.3 Parade Route

The street parade will:-

- start from Banyette Street, at the western side of the intersection of Bong Bong Street.
- turn left from Banyette Street into Bong Bong Street.
- proceed north along Bong Street to Wingecarribee Street.

Parade vehicles will either turn left into Wingecarribee Street or proceed on to the Merrigang Street intersection where they return to normal road rules and regulations and proceed on and away from the parade area.

Pedestrians will turn right into the Corbett Plaza pedestrian mall opposite Wingecarribee Street and will proceed eastward through the mall.

3.4 Finish Area

The street parade finishes in the mall.

Parade walkers disperse in the mall and walk along the northern footpath on the eastern section of Wingecarribee Street to the gateway into the Corbett Gardens for further event activities.

4.2 Traffic Controllers

18 x Authorised Traffic Controllers will be located at all road closure points, intersections within the event areas, assembly and finish areas, and other locations as required.

Traffic Controllers duties will include :-

- monitor the Banyette Street and Station Street assembly areas from 6.00 a.m. on the morning of the parade and ask motorists to park elsewhere if they intend to still be parked in these areas after 5.00 p.m..
- stop traffic on Station Street and also at the exits to the service station and Aldi supermarket in Banyette Street when parade walkers are crossing from the car park assembly area into Banyette Street for the start of the parade.
- slow, stop and detour motorists approaching the barrier boards at all road closure and other detour points while the road closures are in place.
- direct all traffic including heavy vehicles wanting to use the closed section of Bong Bong Street to use the detours in place while the street parade is in progress.
- direct cyclists to use detours in place or ask cyclists who want to watch the parade to walk with their bikes into the street parade area.
- prevent traffic exiting the Shell service station in Bong Bong Street travelling north while the Street Parade is in progress.
 - Traffic will still be able to enter and also exit the service station via Bowral Street.
- proceed in front of the street parade to try and prevent any remaining vehicles parked in Bong Bong Street leaving their parking space and driving through the street parade while it travels along Bong Bong Street.
- place barrier boards on Boolwey Street at the Bong Bong Street intersection, to prevent traffic disobeying flashing yellow traffic lights while the street parade is in progress.

4.3 Advance Warning Signs

Advance Warning Signs to be installed :-

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Section 5. PUBLIC CONSIDERATIONS

5.1 Emergency Vehicles

Traffic controllers will maintain a three to four metre wide access path for emergency vehicles to all areas of the assembly areas, parade and / or race routes, and the finish areas.

The section of Banyette Street between Bong Bong Street and Argyle Lane will be used to assemble emergency services vehicles such as any SES and Fire Brigade vehicles that are participating in the Street Parade.

This will allow for the need for emergency vehicles to leave instantly if required.

5.2 Spectators and Pedestrians

There will be no restrictions to public pedestrians and event spectators in Bong Bong Street except for the following:-

Traffic Controllers will prevent pedestrians crossing Bong Street at the Boolwey Street traffic lights while the street parade is passing through the intersection .

Traffic Controllers will prevent pedestrians crossing Bong Bong Street at the pedestrian crossing south of Wingecarribee Street while the Street Parade is passing over the crossing.

5.3 Public Transport

Taxis will be able to access the taxi rank in Bong Bong Street, opposite Wingecarribee Street, between 6.45 p.m. and 8.00 p.m. on Saturday 02-12-23.

Taxis will exit this section of Bong Bong Street via the western section of Wingecarribee Street.

5.4 Roadside Parking in Bong Bong Street. Saturday 02-12-23

Traffic Controllers will begin delineating off roadside car parking spaces in Bong Bong Street as they become vacant from 4.30 p.m.

Cars will not be able to access the roadside parking spaces in Bong Bong Street, between Merrigang Street and Bowral Street, from 4.30 p.m. to approximately 8.00 p.m.

Cars that are still parked in any spaces in Bong Bong Street while the Street Parade is in progress will be prevented from leaving their parking space until the parade has passed.

5.5 Terrorism

5.5.1 Terrorism Risk Assessment

Event management will refer to the Australian Government 'Guide to Terrorism in Crowded Places' 2017 to determine the level of risk of terrorism for this event, before deciding what measures and / or control methods will be deemed sufficient for this event.

5.5.2 Suspect activity

Traffic Controllers and Event Marshals will be given an event pre-start induction, including what to do if suspicious activity is observed. This page of the TMP will be used as part of the induction documentation.

Suspicious activity includes a person or persons :-

- observing and / or taking notes of the procedures used by event staff.
- observing and / or taking notes of patron movements.
- taking photos from a car or a distance.
- becoming concerned or trying to conceal themselves if they notice they are being observed by any staff.

The traffic controller or event marshal must :-

- not put yourself in any danger or approach anyone acting suspiciously.
- notify nearby traffic controllers or event marshals and security staff as soon as possible of your concerns of suspicious activity.
- notify the traffic manager as soon as possible of your concerns of suspicious activity.
- take note of suspicious vehicle description including registration plate details if possible.
- take notes of suspicious persons description including height, build, clothing, appearance, etc.

The traffic manager must :-

- notify the event manager and site manger as soon as possible of the traffic controllers or event marshals concerns and the location of the traffic controller or event marshal.
- Follow the instructions given by either police, the security manager or the event manager.

5.5.3 Vehicle incursion

Vehicle incursion into areas where large numbers of people are congregated is now being used as a method of terrorist activity resulting in serious injury and death to pedestrians.

An outdoor event poses many risks for vehicle incursion due to the general open ground layout including :-

- Vehicle access from public roads around and into the event area.
- Vehicle access within the event site.
- Vehicular movements beside pedestrian walkways and footpaths.

Measures taken to minimize the risk of this occurring at the event site may include :-

- Minimise or eliminate the vehicle access points to the event area.
 This could include restricted access points, detours and public road closures.
- Minimise or eliminate the vehicle access points inside the event site.
 This could include internal road closures and restricted access points.
- Install vehicular anti incursion barriers at external road closure points.
- Install vehicular anti incursion barriers at internal incursion points.
- Install vehicular anti incursion barriers beside pedestrian walkways and footpaths.

Section 6. PERMITS

6.1 Shire Permit

A S138 "permit to use a road reserve" or letter of approval must be obtained from Wingecarribee Shire Council, prior to traffic controllers installing signs and devices and controlling traffic on any shire property on Saturday 02-12-23.

This Traffic Management Plan will be sent to the Traffic Engineer at Wingecarribee Shire Council.

This Traffic Management Plan is the document to be assessed by the Local Traffic Safety Committee as part of the application for Wingecarribee Shire Council approval.

6.2 TfNSW Road Occupancy Licence

A "Road Occupancy Licence" must be obtained from the TfNSW at Wollongong, prior to traffic controllers installing signs and devices and controlling traffic on any TfNSW property on Saturday 02-12-23.

The ROL application to TfNSW will be made after this TMP has been examined at the Local Traffic Committee meeting and a letter of approval has been obtained from Wingecarribee Shire Council.

The application will include all LRA's, all TGS' and the following forms

- TfNSW Form N Road Occupancy Licence (ROL) Application
- TfNSW Form C Road Occupancy Licence (ROL) Checklist

Section 2 - EVENT DETAILS

2.2 Event Description

The Iris Country Fair :-

- is a school fair held every five years within the grounds of Frensham School, located on Range Road at Mittagong.
- will be held on Saturday 18th November, 2023.
- will start at 9.00 a.m. and finish at 4.00 p.m.
- will be a mixture of stalls, exhibitions and activities.

Attendances up to 5,000 people has been planned for.

Event patrons shall be arriving and leaving throughout the day.

Sections of Range Road, Railway Parade, Oxford Street, Waverley Parade and Tyndall Street will be affected by event traffic from 7.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. on the day of the event.

Peak traffic arrivals during the ingress phase are expected between 10.00 a.m. and 1.00 p.m.

Peak traffic departures during the egress phase are expected between 1.00 p.m. and 3.00 p.m.

Section 3 - AFFECTED ROADS

3.1 Wingecarribee Shire Council roads

Part of the event area will affect the section of Range Road between Railway Parade and Waverley Parade.

Sections of Range Road, Railway Parade, Oxford Street, Waverley Parade and Tyndall Street will be affected by event traffic from 8.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. on the day of the event.

3.2 Part road Closures

Range Road will be closed in the northbound direction only between Tyndall Street and Railway Parade.

Barrier Boards with "Road Closed" and "Detour" signs attached to be installed at the intersection of Range Road and Tyndall Street. Detours in place.

Access to Range Road will be maintained via the Railway Avenue & Colo Street roundabout.

Waverley Parade will be closed in the eastbound direction only between Oxford Street and Range Road.

Detour for east bound traffic on Waverley Parade to be installed at the intersection of Waverley Parade and Oxford Street.

3.4 Other Changed Traffic Conditions

Traffic flow in the closed section of Range Road to be limited to traffic travelling one way only in a southbound direction from the road closure at Railway Parade to the Tyndall Road intersection.

Southbound traffic flow will return to two lane two way to the sports ground car park entrance.

Traffic Controllers will monitor the southbound traffic entering the closed section of Range Road.

4.1 Signs and Devices

Advance Warning Signs to be installed on :-

- Range Road on the southbound approach to the Railway Parade intersection.
- Range Road on the northbound approach to the road closure at the Tyndall Street intersection.
- Colo Street on the approach to the Range Road intersection.
- Railway Parade on the approach to the Range Road intersection.
- Oxford Street on the approach to the Waverley Parade intersection.
- Range Road on the approach to the sports ground entry & exit track.

Barrier boards with "Road Closed" signs attached will be installed at :-

- the intersection of Range Road and Tyndall Street.
- the intersection of Waverley Parade and Oxford Street.
- the intersection of Range Road and Waverley Parade.

Detour directional signs will be installed on Range Road, Tyndall Street, Oxford Street and Railway Parade.

"No Roadside Parking" and "No Stopping" signs will be installed on:-

Section 4 - TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT

4.2 Traffic Controllers

- 4 x Traffic Controllers will be required to set up and dismantle the work site on the day of the event.
- 6 x Traffic Controllers will be required on site from 7.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. on the day of the event.

Traffic Controllers shall assist traffic :-

- on Range Road at the southern road closure point.
- on Range Road at the pedestrian crossings.
- on Waverley Parade "no roadside parking" and "drop off & pick up" areas.
- on Range Road at the Waverley Parade intersection.
- on Waverley Parade at the road closure point.
- on Vernon Street at the accessible / disabled parking area.

Traffic controllers will maintain a minimum three metre wide access path for emergency vehicles on the public roads through or around the event area.

4.3 Advertising

Event organisers will distribute letters to residents within the part road closures detailing access directions on the day of the event.

Section 5 - PARKING & PUBLIC TRANSPORT

5.1 Roadside Parking

Roadside parking will be permitted on the shoulders of all streets surrounding the event.

Parking will be restricted along the northern shoulder of the closed section of Waverley Parade and at the sportsground entry & exit track in Range Road.

5.2 Off street Parking

Off street parking for vehicles attending the event will be provided within the sports ground on the eastern side of Range Road.

Access to the car park will be via the entry and exit point on Range Road east of the hockey field.

The off street parking has a capacity of up to 500 cars.

5.3 Accessible / Disabled Car Parking

The Accessible / Disabled car park shall be located on the southern shoulder of Vernon Street.

The Accessible / Disabled car park shall have a capacity of up to 10 cars.

5.4 Stall holder Car Park

The stall holder car park shall be located within the grounds of Frensham School.

Frensham School staff or volunteers will organize and implement the stall holder parking.

Section 5 - PARKING & PUBLIC TRANSPORT

5.6 Drop Off & Pick Up areas

The public drop off & pick up area shall be located on the eastern side of Stanley Street, near the intersection of Vernon Street. The public drop off & pick up area shall have a capacity of up to 5 cars.

5.7 Shuttle Buses

A shuttle bus will be operating on the day of the event.

The drop off and pick up zone at the event area for the shuttle bus will be located on the eastern shoulder in the one-way section of Range Road.

5.8 Taxis

The Taxi Rank will be located with the public drop off and pick up area.

The Taxi Rank will have a capacity of up to 1 taxi.

5.9 Pedestrians

A pedestrian walkway will be created from the off street parking near the hockey field to Range Road.

A pedestrian crossing point will be created on Range Road at the pedestrian access track.

A pedestrian crossing point will also be created on Range Road at the northern access point to the school.

Traffic controllers will stop traffic on Range Road when the pedestrians are crossing the road.

5.10 Wet Weather Contingency Plan

If it is considered that the sports ground is too wet to park on then all wet weather parking shall be on roadsides only.

Section 6 - EMERGENCY SERVICES ACCESS

6.1 Emergency Vehicles

Traffic controllers will maintain a minimum three metre wide access path for emergency vehicles on the public roads through or around the event area

Traffic controllers will stop traffic and assist any emergency services vehicle with lights and sirens activated through or around the event area.

Emergency services vehicles will have a reserved area for parking on the northern shoulder of the closed section of Waverley Parade.

Section 7 - OTHER PUBLIC CONSIDERATIONS

7.1 Neighbours

The Iris Country Fair is supported by the nearby residents of Frensham School.

The event has an impact on the neighbourhood that is understood and tolerated by the local residents as a once every 5 years event.

Every effort will be made by event organisers and traffic controllers to keep residents driveways clear of parked cars for the duration of the event.

7.2 Public Transport

As the event is on a Saturday no school buses will be affected.

Public transport services on a Saturday in this part of Mittagong shall be minimal also.

Buses, taxis and other public transport carrying out their business on the day of the event will have minimal disruption and delays to their operations while travelling in the vicinity of Frensham School.

No dust will be generated by the event.

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Section 8 - PERMITS AND APPROVALS

8.1 Police / LAC approval

Schedule 1 Form - Notice of Intention to Hold a Public Assembly.

The Schedule 1 Form - Notice of Intention to Hold a Public Assembly is one of the documents that will be referred to as part of the police giving approval for the proposed traffic management at the event.

Commonly known as a Form 1, the Notice of Intention to Hold a Public Assembly is the document that needs to be provided to police and it outlines the necessary details.

The notice should be submitted at least seven days before a scheduled assembly, and if no opposition is voiced by the commissioner, then it is legal.

The event organiser will submit the form by taking it to their nearest police station or courthouse at least five days before the event.

They should also contact the officer in charge of the police station nearest the event if a road has to be closed.

The police approval may give instruction to have certain additional requirements and / or conditions planned for and applied to the traffic management process on the day of the event.

Local Area Command.

The Traffic Management Plan will be considered at the next Local Traffic Committee meeting, of which the Police Local Area Commander is one of the members.

Police approval from the Local Area Command (LAC) at Goulburn will be obtained as part of the traffic management application and approval process through Council.

The police approval may give instruction to have certain additional requirements and / or conditions planned for and applied to the traffic management process on the day of the event.

Section 8 - PERMITS AND APPROVALS

8.2 Shire Permit

Form S138.

Section 138 of the Roads Act 1993 requires event organisers to obtain consent from the relevant authority (usually the local council) to carry out works on, over or under a public road.

The application process and requirements may vary depending on the type and location of the works.

The event organiser will check with Wingecarribee Shire Council for specific details and fees.

A 'S138' permit will be obtained from Wingecarribee Shire Council by the event organisers prior to the event.

Online lodgement of Consent For Works and Structures in or on a Public Road (Section 138) is now mandatory via the NSW Planning Portal.

Local Traffic Committee.

This Traffic Management Plan will be sent to the Traffic Engineer at Wingecarribee Shire Council.

The Traffic Management Plan will be considered at the next Local Traffic Committee meeting, of which the Shire Traffic Engineer is one of the members.

The LTC recommendations from the LTC meeting will be forwarded to Council for the next council meeting.



5.1 Patrons and other Pedestrians

Bendooley Street

The footpath outside of Corbett Gardens on Bendooley Street will be delineated on the approach to the main entry gate into the gardens.

The footpath is 3.3 metres wide.

It will be divided into a 1.5 metre wide aisle beside the gardens fence for patrons to queue outside of the entry gate for 5 metres towards Wingecarribee Street and for 5 metres towards Merrigang Street.

There will be 1.7 - 1.8 metres remaining for public pedestrian access along the footpath past the entry gate to the gardens.

Wingecarribee Street

There will be no restrictions to public pedestrians and event patrons on the footpath outside of Corbett Gardens in Wingecarribee Street.

Merrigang Street

There will be no restrictions to public pedestrians and event patrons on the footpath outside of Corbett Gardens in Merrigang Street.

5.2 Other Public Transport

Public transport will not be affected.

05-06-23. Spoke to Chris Moule (operations manager) at Berrima Bus-lines.

Chris confirmed that the existing bus zone outside of Corbett Gardens in Merrigang Street is not part of the town bus service stops and is not used by Berrima Bus-lines.

The bus zone is apparently for charter buses visiting Bowral or the Corbett Gardens throughout the year.

The extension to the bus zone during the Food & Wine Festival will not affect Berrima Bus-lines.

5.3 Emergency Vehicles.

The signage installation and parking restrictions will not have an effect on emergency vehicles travelling past Corbett Gardens

A three to four metre wide travelled path for emergency vehicles on all streets around Corbett Gardens will be available at all times.

5.4 Terrorism.

5.4.1 Terrorism Risk Assessment.

Event management will refer to the Australian Government 'Guide to Terrorism in Crowded Places' 2017 to determine the level of risk of terrorism for this event, before deciding what measures and / or control methods will be deemed sufficient for this event.

5.4.2 Suspect activity.

Traffic Controllers and Event Marshals will be given an event pre-start induction, including what to do if suspicious activity is observed. This page of the TMP will be used as part of the induction documentation.

Suspicious activity includes a person or persons :-

- observing and / or taking notes of the procedures used by event staff.
- observing and / or taking notes of patron movements.
- taking photos from a car or a distance.
- becoming concerned or trying to conceal themselves if they notice they are being observed by any staff.

The traffic controller or event marshal must :-

- not put yourself in any danger or approach anyone acting suspiciously.
- notify nearby traffic controllers or event marshals and security staff as soon as possible of your concerns of suspicious activity.
- notify the traffic manager as soon as possible of your concerns of suspicious activity.
- take note of suspicious vehicle description including registration plate details if possible.
- take notes of suspicious persons description including height, build, clothing, appearance, etc.

The traffic manager must :-

- notify the event manager and site manger as soon as possible of the traffic controllers or event marshals concerns and the location of the traffic controller or event marshal.
- Follow the instructions given by either Police, the security manager or the event manager.

5.4.3 Vehicle incursion.

Vehicle incursion into areas where large numbers of people are congregated is now being used as a method of terrorist activity resulting in serious injury and death to pedestrians.

An outdoor event poses many risks for vehicle incursion due to the general open ground layout including :-

- Vehicle access from public roads around and into the event area.
- Vehicle access within the event site.
- Vehicular movements beside pedestrian walkways and footpaths.

Measures taken to minimize the risk of this occurring at the event site may include :-

- Minimise or eliminate the vehicle access points to the event area.
 - This could include restricted access points, detours and public road closures.
- Minimise or eliminate the vehicle access points inside the event site.
 - This could include internal road closures and restricted access points.
- Install vehicular anti incursion barriers at external road closure points.
- Install vehicular anti incursion barriers at internal incursion points.
- Install vehicular anti incursion barriers beside pedestrian walkways and footpaths.




Pedestrian ramp with delineation and signs to be installed in the middle car space of the disabled parking zone.



REPORT

The Australia Day Street Parade is proposed to be held on Friday 26th January 2024 in Berrima.

The procedure for the Street Parade will start at 12:00 pm and will conclude at approximately 1:00 pm.

Traffic control will be put in place from 8:00 am with preliminary road closures, and to assist with parade participants arriving between 10:00 am and 11:00 am.

The street parade participants will assemble in Oxley Street (east) and travel south down the Old Hume Highway through Berrima and finish at Market Place.

The shoulders of Oxley Street are the main assembly areas for the Street Parade. Oxley Street (east) will be closed to public parking at 8.00 am Oxley Street will be re-opened to public traffic at 12.15 pm.

A marching band will lead the parade. Many historic and classic vehicles, walking groups and other event vehicles will participate in the street parade.

















6.9 Mount Broughton Road Double Barrier Lines

Report Author: Traffic Engineer

Authoriser: Karin Targa, Director Service and Project Delivery

PURPOSE

To assess the replacement of dashed continuity road centre line marking to double barrier line marking.

RECOMMENDATION

<u>THAT</u> the proposed double barrier centre line marking for Mount Broughton Road be approved for installation.

REPORT

Council have recently reconstructed the road pavement along Mount Broughton Road near Bibbys Lane, Moss Vale with Black Spot funding to Improve road safety. Council's Operations team were concerned that the continuity lines that allow for overtaking manoeuvres on Mount Broughton Road, near Bibbys Lane, are unsafe and may not meet standards for sight distance. Mount Broughton Road is a 90km/h zone.

Solid double barrier lines were installed following the reconstruction of the road and are currently in place.

A review was undertaken of the sight distance for oncoming vehicles and found to not meet Austroads guidelines for overtaking.

The sight distance of oncoming traffic in opposing directions is 530m, with continuity lines allowing overtaking over a 240m distance. Both distances are substandard for 90km/h according to Austroads guidelines.

5.6.2 Overtaking Model


The overtaking manoeuvre has a large number of variables, such as the:

- · judgement of the overtaking driver and the risks the driver is prepared to take
- · speed and size of vehicles to be overtaken
- · speed of the overtaking vehicle
- · speed of a potential oncoming vehicle
- evasive action or braking undertaken by the vehicle or the overtaken vehicle.

Overtaking is assessed by means of a model that was derived from research into overtaking on Australian rural roads (Troutbeck 1981). There are two main considerations with the overtaking model (Figure 5.5):

- Establishment: A minimum sight distance that is adequate to encourage a given proportion of drivers to
 commence an overtaking manoeuvre. This is called the Overtaking Establishment Sight Distance (OED)
 as it establishes a length of road as a potential overtaking zone. OED is the sight distance required for
 most drivers of passenger cars to overtake other vehicles.
- Continuation: A critical sight distance, which if maintained for some length of road after the OED has
 become available, will enable an overtaking driver to either complete or abandon a manoeuvre already
 commenced with safety. This is called the Overtaking Continuation Sight Distance (OCD). After the
 establishment sight distance first becomes available, an overtaking zone is assumed to extend as long as
 this shorter distance remains available, subject to the constraint in the next paragraph.

5.6.3 Determination of Overtaking Provision

The values in this Guide (refer Table 5.8 and Table 5.9) are the distances for the 85th percentile overtaking manoeuvres, adopted from the research ARRB undertook during a major research project on overtaking on Australian rural roads (Troutbeck 1981). These distances indicate the overtaking sight distances to be used in determining the overtaking zones on MCV (multiple combination vehicle) routes.

Briefly, Overtaking Establishment Sight Distance (OED) is derived from the size of the time gap accepted by a potential overtaking driver and is derived by the time taken to complete phases 1, 2, 3 and 4 of the total manoeuvre (Figure 5.5) and calculated using Equation 2.

Given a low driver eye height of 1.1 m, most car drivers cannot adequately distinguish differences in sight distance for values greater than about 1000 m. Therefore, sight distances listed in excess of 1000 m can be assumed to be satisfied whenever the actual sight distance exceeds 1000 m.

The listed sight distance values have been derived from the overtaking model (Troutbeck 1981). Sight distance values have been rounded to the nearest 10 m. Given the inherent level of precision in the overtaking model, it would be incorrect to determine that an overtaking zone does not exist when the actual sight distance falls below a relevant listed value by about 10 m.

Overtaking opportunities for vehicles past Bibbys Lane are 1km to Yarrawa Road for eastbound traffic and 2.3km on Mount Broughton Road for westbound traffic.

CONCLUSION

The overtaking sight distances on Mount Broughton Road, near Bibby's Lane do not meet the minimum standards as stated in Austroads guidelines. The double barrier lines that are currently in place should remain to prevent overtaking manoeuvres.
