
Purpose of the Annual Report

Activities delayed included:

- Undertake a review of all Farmland rating properties to ensure they comply with section 515 of the Local Government Act 1993.
- Commence preparation of a master plan for the Resource Recovery Centre.
- Undertake the forward design of footpaths, shared paths and cycle ways projects in the four-year capital works program.
- Participate in the regional project 2024 tender for the disposal of waste.
