Net Impact of Budget Adjustments

Income

- \$180K Rates & Annual Charges
- ▼\$252K User Charges & Fees

Budget Adjustments - Operational Income

- \$4.1M increase in Investment Income, with \$3.1M attributed to the Water and Sewer fund.
- \$867K increase in Capital Grants for the Local Roads LRCI Phase 4 Funding.
- \$637K increase to Other Income relating to workers compensation premium refund relating to 2022/23.
- \$256K increase in User Fees and Charges for Tulip Time income.
- \$180K decrease in Rates Income relating to lower than forecast supplementary rates revenue being levied during the financial year.
- \$503K decrease in User Fees and Charges relating to reduction in Putrescible Waste tipping services offset by associated expenditure.
- \$170K reduction in Other Income relating to Parking Fine Revenue



Budget Adjustments – Operational Expenditure

- \$1.55M decrease in Salaries and Wages due to staff vacancies, offset by
 - General Fund budgeted staff vacancies \$676K
 - Emergency Operations Centre recognised \$270K
- \$400K increase in Salaries and Wages due to impact of proposed new salary system and PD review
- \$400K decrease in workers compensation insurance premium.
- \$100K increase in recruitment costs
- \$320K increase for the procurement of Telematics GPS systems
- \$2.17M increase to contractor expenses for Planning Assessment & Regulation, partially offset by \$435K in salary savings



Budget Adjustments – Capital Expenditure

- \$200K increase for Bowral Memorial Hall fit out
- \$327K increase for Railway Park Colo Vale project
- \$867K increase for Bong Bong common intersection upgrade grant funded Local Road and Community Infrastructure (LRCI)
- \$655K increase for Berrima Rd bridge
- \$664K increase for Robinson St Culvert renewal
- \$50K deferral of kerb ramp renewal projects
- \$50K deferral of roadside furniture renewal & upgrades program
- \$150K savings on segment of Range Rd renewal
- \$375K decrease for new footpath program
- Reduction in costs of \$439K for Moss Vale bypass project
- \$1.3M decrease for Old South Rd rehabilitation
- \$1.8M decrease for Old South Rd Renewal to adjust for funding brought forward into 2022/23



Utilising Developer Contributions

- \$1.029M Developer Contributions proposed to replace SRV funding of 5 projects completed in 2022/23 as part of ongoing funding review.
- These projects were:
 - Camelia garden bed renewal at Bowral Railway Station
 - Loseby Park lighting upgrade
 - Cook Street Playground
 - Church Street Playground
 - Eridge Park netball courts lighting upgrade

- Projects listed above account for \$18.9M of the \$21M grant related debtors as at 30 September 2023
- DRFA is a reimbursement style funding arrangement based on successful claims
 - \$4.7M of the DRFA claims have been assessed successfully, funds to be received in Q2
- Capital programs above are "reimbursement" style funding agreements, where Council receives funds upon completion of works

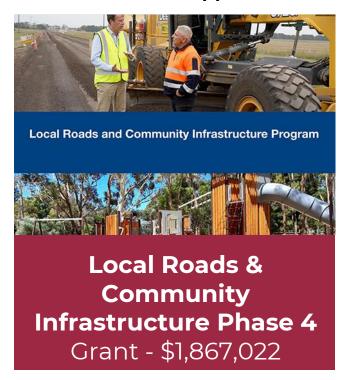

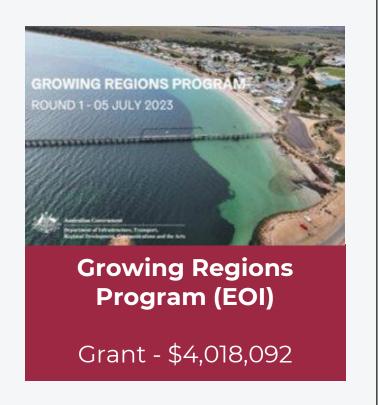
