PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to recommend funds for local organisations for community resilience projects under the Community Resilience Small Grants Program 2023.

OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

THAT:

- 1. Council provides a Community Resilience Small Grant to the following community organisations for the following amounts:

REPORT

BACKGROUND

In 2020/21 Council received funding to the sum of \$250,000 from the NSW Government under the Bushfire Community Recovery and Resilience Fund following the Black Summer Bushfires. This funding was distributed across a range of projects such as Stakeholder Mapping to assist recovery support services, community connection events, a previous small grants program for community and a specialist rebuild service for those navigating the Development Application process due to house and outbuilding damage.

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A variation was submitted to NSW reconstruction Authority (formally Resilience NSW) in 2023 for the unspent funding of \$73,360 from the above projects to be re-invested into community-based projects that assisted in building resilience across the Wingecarribee by creating the Community Resilience Small Grants Program 2023 (The Program).

The Program was designed to offer financial assistance to not-for-profit community organisations and associations based in the Wingecarribee Local Government Area to deliver a range of resilience focused projects.

The Program will support collaborative efforts between community groups and organisations to deliver local and innovative projects that support the aim of the grant.

The Program provided one-off grants of \$500 - \$10,000. The Program opened via the Smartygrants portal from Monday 21 August 2023 and closed on Friday 29 September 2023. Projects must be delivered by Friday 1 December 2023.

The Program aimed to support bushfire impacted communities:

- With preparedness projects that are community led
- Provide opportunity for community connection
- Strengthen community resilience

REPORT

Applications were assessed by professional officers in accordance with the Policy against the criteria within Community Resilience Small Grants Program Guidelines. Staff recommendations were then reviewed by the relevant Manager to ensure transparency and probity.

The program received a total of 19 applications with a total request of \$108,000.
