A resource recovery centre is a key part of our fight against unnecessary waste. Still, valuable materials are diverted away from landfill and sold back into the community at a fraction of their price allowing the reuse and upcycling of everything from everyday items to collectables and antiques.

Who currently operates the Reviva Centre?

Resource Recovery Ltd has had the contract to run the Council's 'Tip Shop' for the past ten years.

This contract has reached its expiration date and in so doing the Council has agreed to continue the operations of the outlet.

Is the Reviva Centre closing?

No. The Reviva Centre will continue to operate under a new name from 23 March 2024 and be directly operated by Council.

Will the name change?

What are the benefits to the community of this transition?
